Cheyenne Regional Named a 2026 Healthgrades Outstanding Patient Experience Award Recipient

Cheyenne Regional Medical Center received the 2026 Healthgrades Outstanding Patient Experience Award, placing the organization among top hospitals nationwide for patient experience. The recognition is based on patient feedback and evaluates measures including communication with providers, staff responsiveness, medication explanations and the overall hospital environment.

U.S. News & World Report Recognizes Cheyenne Regional in 2026-2027 Best Hospitals Rankings

Cheyenne Regional Medical Center earned the No. 1 ranking in Wyoming for Rehabilitation in U.S. News & World Report's 2026-2027 Best Hospitals rankings. CRMC also received High Performing ratings for Rehabilitation, Colon Cancer Surgery and Pacemaker Implantation. The annual rankings evaluate hospitals using measures including patient outcomes, complication rates, patient experience and other indicators of clinical quality.

Emergency Department Earns 2026 ENA Lantern Award®

Cheyenne Regional Medical Center's Emergency Department earned the 2026 Lantern Award® from the Emergency Nurses Association, one of the nation's highest honors recognizing excellence in emergency care. CRMC is one of just 126 emergency departments nationwide to receive the 2026 award, which recognizes outstanding leadership, clinical practice, education, advocacy, research, quality outcomes and workplace culture.

Same Day Surgery and PACU Earn National Certification Achievement Award

The American Board of Perianesthesia Nursing Certification Inc. recognized Cheyenne Regional Medical Center's Same Day Surgery and Post Anesthesia Care Units with the 2026 ABPANC Certification Achievement Award. The recognition is awarded to facilities where at least 75% of eligible perianesthesia nurses hold CPAN or CAPA specialty certification, placing CRMC among a select group of organizations nationwide meeting the benchmark.

CLINICAL INNOVATION AND FIRSTS

Cheyenne Regional First in Wyoming to Offer LimFlow TADV Procedure

Cheyenne Regional Medical Center became the first hospital in Wyoming to offer Transcatheter Arterialization of the Deep Veins using the LimFlow TADV System. The minimally invasive procedure provides a new limb-saving treatment option for patients with Chronic Limb Threatening Ischemia who have exhausted traditional therapies and otherwise may face major amputation. The FDA-approved technology restores blood flow by rerouting oxygen-rich blood through the deep veins to bypass blocked or damaged arteries.

CRMC Introduces DETOUR System for Complex Peripheral Artery Disease

Cheyenne Regional Medical Center expanded treatment options for patients with complex Peripheral Artery Disease by introducing Percutaneous Transmural Arterial Bypass with the DETOUR System. The technology provides an alternative for patients with long obstructions in the superficial femoral artery, previous unsuccessful endovascular procedures or those who may not be candidates for surgical bypass.

Cheyenne Regional First in Region to Implement CARTOSOUND SONATA™ Module

Cheyenne Regional Medical Center became the first hospital in Wyoming, Colorado and the surrounding region—and one of the first health systems in the nation—to implement the CARTOSOUND SONATA™ Module. The AI-powered technology automatically transforms intracardiac echocardiography images into detailed anatomical maps of the heart, providing physicians with enhanced visualization during complex cardiac ablation procedures.

Cheyenne Regional Performs Wyoming's First AVEIR™ Leadless Pacemaker Implants

Cheyenne Regional Medical Center successfully completed Wyoming's first AVEIR™ leadless pacemaker implants from Abbott, including atrial leadless pacemakers and the AVEIR™ DR dual chamber leadless pacemaker system. Implanted directly into the heart through a minimally invasive procedure, the technology eliminates the cardiac leads used with traditional pacemakers and provides another advanced treatment option for patients with abnormal or slow heart rhythms.

Cheyenne Regional Performs Wyoming's First Amulet™ Procedures

Cheyenne Regional Medical Center performed Wyoming's first implantations of the Amplatzer™ Amulet™ Left Atrial Appendage Occluder, expanding stroke-prevention options for certain patients with atrial fibrillation. The minimally invasive device seals the area of the heart where blood clots commonly form and provides an alternative for patients who may not be good candidates for long-term blood-thinning medication.

CRMC Administers First PLUVICTO® Treatment

Cheyenne Regional Medical Center administered its first PLUVICTO® treatment, expanding advanced cancer treatment options for patients with prostate cancer in Wyoming. The targeted therapy is designed for patients with advanced prostate cancer who have undergone other treatments and works by locating cancer cells and delivering treatment directly to them, helping reduce damage to nearby healthy tissue.

CRMC Expands Adolescent Behavioral Health Care with NeuroStar TMS

Cheyenne Regional Medical Center expanded access to behavioral health services by offering NeuroStar Transcranial Magnetic Stimulation therapy for adolescents ages 15 to 21 with major depressive disorder. The FDA-cleared, noninvasive therapy uses targeted electromagnetic stimulation to activate areas of the brain involved in mood regulation, providing a medication-free treatment option for eligible patients.
